Biophony

Called "riveting" by the San Francisco Chronicle,
Alonzo King's Biophony is a fascinating investigation
of life on Earth. Created in collaboration with natural
soundscape artist Bernie Krause and composer Richard
Blackford, the score draws from the rainforests of
Borneo, a waterhole in Kenya, the Alaskan tundra,
and a meadow high in the Sierra Nevada mountains,
echoing animal voices and imprints of habitats in peril.
King's visionary choreography, brought to life by the
extraordinary LINES dancers, has an earthy feeling that
imbues classical ballet with new, expressive potential.
Dancers crawl, fly, elongate, flutter, and somersault,
creating composites of otherworldly creatures.
