LEARNING TARGET

- Annual indoor concerts at Northrop







The band performs in other settings, too:

- Smaller student groups, the brass quintet, and "flash mob" bands perform on campus and in the community.
- If you attend Gopher basketball, hockey, or volleyball home games, you will likely see one of the Athletic Bands playing favorite tunes in the stands.







Membership in the marching band is open to all interested U of M students. The band is often comprised of over 100 different majors and every college at the University.
