

Tradition

Northrop's hallmarks:

- Founded by the University of Minnesota Alumni Association
- · Host of the University's most important ceremonial events
- Home to some of the Twin Cities' most beloved arts institutions including today's Minnesota Orchestra for 45 years (1929-74)
- Presented the Metropolitan Opera for 41 seasons (1945-86)
- Musical performances (established in 1919) by world-renowned artists including Yehudi Menuhin, Van Cliburn, Paul Robeson, Marian Anderson, Dave Brubeck, Duke Ellington, and Wynton Marsalis
- Historic dance series (established in 1932) including the Ballet Russes, Bolshoi Ballet, Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Martha Graham Dance Company, and Merce Cunningham Dance Company
- Host of world leaders such as Margaret Mead, T.S. Eliot, Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, President Bill Clinton, and the Dalai Lama
